NOVEMBER 2022 NOTES FROM THE VISION COMMITTEE AND THE CHURCH PARTNERSHIP TEAM

- The Vision Committee is addressing the following items:
 - Immanuel's alternative futures with a focus on:
 - Alternative Future One: Becoming the best possible member-led church (small but mighty)—the pathway that Immanuel is on now.
 - Alternative Future Two: covenant agreement with another church (shared pastor?)—United Church or St. Paul's (or combine Future One and Future Two)—see "B" below.
 - (A few other alternative futures are being explored as well.)
 - Balance a focus on exploring alternative futures with a focus on ministries for current active members, "lapsed" members who have desire to return, and community outreach.
 - Establish a three-year window for decisions regarding Immanuel's future with emphasis on decisions to be made during the next three, six, and twelve months.
 - Changes in logo, letterhead, signage, etc. to increase Immanuel's identity in the community.
 - Have an appraisal done of the value of Immanuel's assets (approved by the Church Council).
 - Contact with the Shuberg family regarding deed restrictions on the Fuller Avenue property (first contact made)
 - Contact with the Mission Investment Fund (ELCA) to review guidelines related to each alternative future.
 - Identify organizations other than churches that might rent or share space at Immanuel to produce additional revenue.
 - Explore upgrading of the building (kitchen upgrade, elevator, roadway to lower floor) to increase possibility of rental of space to community organizations.
 - Agenda for the December 4 congregational conversation.

The Church Partnerships Team is addressing the following items:

Get examples of other covenant agreements between churches from the Synod.

- Planning for small-group meeting with United (burch (a first contact has been made and next steps are being considered).
 - Preparation for first small-group meeting.
 - Agenda for meeting.
- Preparation for initial contact with St. Paul's Lutheran in Reed City (update existing document).
- Explore partnerships with other churches in the Big Rapids region.
- General discussion: What strengths do we bring to a partnership with another church? What are we willing to give up? Do we have missions, values, and goals that are compatible? Are there ecumenical agreements and/or compatible doctrines? ~Gunder Myran





The snow is coming down in big snowflakes—makes for a beautiful winter wonderland! As our advent season has begun, let us prepare our hearts for Christmas. The 25th of December is the day Jesus our Savior was born. Let's keep Christ in Christmas!

Our Health News for December:

- This Week, December 5-11, 2022 is National Handwashing Awareness Week. One of the best ways to prevent getting sick and spreading germs to others is to keep our hands clean by washing them with soap and water or using a 60% alcohol sanitizer. Examples include before and after preparing food, before eating food, before and after caring for someone who is sick, after using the toilet, after changing diapers, feeding pets, and after handling garbage. Wet hands with soap and water, wash every part of the hands while singing Happy Birthday twice. Rinse hands with water and dry with a clean towel.
- 2. December 5-9, 2022 is Older Driver Safety Week. As a person ages, one can have visual, cognitive, and movement difficulties. The American Automobile Association (AAA) recommends contacting occupational therapy driver rehabilitation specialists for comprehensive evaluation. These assessments can identify areas for improvement and keep people able to drive safely.
- 3. December is National Influenza Awareness Vaccination Time. For those of you who have not yet received your "flu shot", this is a good time to have it. Everyone six months and older needs a flu vaccine injection every year. If you haven't had yours, this is a good time to do it.
- 4. December is World AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) Awareness Month. AIDS is caused by the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). AIDS is the last phase of the disease, when the body is unable to fight a disease or infection. An estimated 1,189,700 people in the United States had HIV at the end of 2019, the most recent year for which this information is available. In 2020, 30,635 people received an HIV diagnosis in the US and dependent areas. The annual number of new diagnosis decreased 8% from 2016 to 2019.
