Update on Building Changes, October, 2022

The Building Use Committee has not met formally, discussions continue. This is an on-going process, we will continue to use the meeting paperwork as it currently stands until revisions are completed. Other issues, including responsibilities of janitor, etc. are also being discussed.

The Conference Room has been occupied by SLD-Read, we must remove our cabinetry that will go into the area being readied for the new library. This is a very slow process.

Relocation of the mailboxes/counter to the Fellowship Hall will commence as allowed by the Tuba Bach events, and may occur after the final concert. New doors are in place, locks have been changed, and new keys will be issued selectively. Thank you to Tim and his team for coordinating this project.

The Council approved the sale of two desks, we will offer them for sale to members initially, and subsequently advertise on Face Book Marketplace. The much- loved furniture from the conference room will be moved to the office area and used for our historical memorabilia. The books left in the fellowship hall have been boxed, they continue to be available free and we have extended their availability time to allow Tuba Bach attendees and others from the community to retrieve any they would like. Library books saved for the new library are either boxed or in book cases located in the Pastor's office. The Pastor's office will be rearranged to accommodate those requiring privacy.

Carol Zimmerman has been diligently working on placing historical pictures in ring binder albums for easy viewing, they are currently in the Fellowship Hall.

As we determine the best way forward, we intend to keep the congregation "in the loop." If you have any questions or would like to donate time/energy/ideas to this effort to keep Immanuel afloat, please do not hesitate to step up! We welcome your input and assistance.

# PARISH NURSE OCTOBER Parish Nurse

Autumn is here and fall will soon be here! Take time to enjoy all the beautiful colored leaves of fall. <u>Fight FLU</u>! Remember to get your <u>flu injection now!!</u> It takes about two weeks for the vaccination to become effective. Check with your doctor to be sure you are a good candidate for the vaccination.

Our Health News for October:

- October 4<sup>th</sup> is National Day of Prayer for Mental Illness Recovery and Understanding. A National Health Reform Bill was passed recently in the U.S. House of Representatives. It would bring future help to those currently suffering from mental illness. The Helping Families in Mental Health Crisis Act would address a nationwide shortage of psychiatric beds and child psychiatrists and also create the federal position of assistant secretary for mental health and substance use disorders to be filled by a psychiatrist or psychologist and take over the responsibilities of the administrator of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration. Hopefully this Act will be approved by the Senate before the end of the year.
- October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Breast cancer is the second leading cause of death among women. The cancer cells (malignant cells start with blood cells.) One in eight U.S. women will be diagnosed with breast cancer (249,660 women in one year—more than 40,000 will die from it). In men, 2,000 will be diagnosed in one year—approximately 440 will die from it. Get your screenings regularly; screenings help reduce the incidence of breast cancer.
- October is Healthy Lung Awareness Month. The American Lung Association is the leading organization working to save lives by improving lung health and preventing lung disease. The two lungs in a person's chest (respiratory system) are responsible for a person to breathe oxygen and exhale carbon dioxide. Some ways to keep lungs healthy include: 1) Avoid cigarette smoke, which may cause lung cancer or COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease), which includes bronchitis and emphysema. 2) Avoid second-hand smoke. 3) Get your house tested for radon gas. 4) Get your flu and pneumonia "shots"" to stay healthy.
- October is National Orthodontics Awareness Month. An orthodontist is a dentist who specializes in the branch of dentistry concerned with irregularities of teeth, malocclusion and associated facial problems. About 70% of children require braces (orthodontia) in order to achieve proper alignment and bite. Adults may also have orthodontia treatment. A new device, Invisalign Teen, is now available for use as well. See your orthodontist for more information
- October is National SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) Awareness Month. SIDS can usually

occur from 1 month to 12 months in an infant's life. Preventative advice includes: 1) Lay infant on his/her back until infant can rollover by his/her self. 2) Use a firm mattress (no soft toys or bedding within baby's reach. 3) No smoking around baby. 4) Keep baby near but not in your bed. 5) Breast feed as long as possible. 6) Immunize baby. 7) Use pacifier to put baby to sleep; remove when asleep. 8) Avoid over-heating baby. 9) Avoid honey until one year old. 10) Avoid cardiac or electronic respirators—not proved safe or effective

Stay Healthy-Boost Your Flu IQ

- 1. Get the Flu Shot!
- 2. Do frequent hand-washing and dry them completely. Damp hands easily transmit infection-causing microbes to surfaces others may touch.
- 3. Stop touching your face.
- 4. Stay away from sick people, if possible.
- 5. Repeat—GET YOUR FLU SHOT!!

**Update from Our Brothers Keeper Shelter** is open year round, 24 hours a day. It does provide a place for individuals and families to work with staff to find housing, employment and referrals to other organizations that may be able to meet the needs of the guests. We currently have space for 15 men, 15 women and 3 special rooms for guests with children. From October 1, 2021 to June 15, 2022, we have served 203 adults and 44 children for a total of 247. We rely of many sources of funding including grants from the Salvation Army ESP program, Fremont Foundation, Mecosta and Osceola Community Foundations, and the many community donors who find it in their hearts to help others in need. This funding allows us to employ a trained staff as well as provide a secure facility.

A Note from Daggett-Gilbert Funeral Home – In years past, except for COVID restrictions, the staff at the Daggett-Gilbert Funeral Home in Big Rapids has invited people experiencing a loss to attend our "Service of Remembrance" for a time of comfort and encouragement.

#### This year's "Service of Remembrance" will be on Tuesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, at 6:00 pm, at the Daggett-Gilbert Funeral Home facilities in Big Rapids.

Previous attendees have expressed how much they were encouraged and comforted by being together with others who have lost a loved one. The service includes music, a devotional, a candle lit in memory of their loved one, a rose to be taken home and a time for fellowship with refreshments served after the service.
