Our shortest month of the year! Enjoy all the Festival of the Arts in Big Rapids this month. Remember this is our Healthy Heart Month and Valentine's Day!

Our Health News for February:

- 1. February is Healthy Heart Awareness Month. The heart is a hollow muscular organ (size of a person's fist) lying to the left of the midline of the chest; it has 4 chambers (an atrium and a ventricle on the right side and an atria and ventricle on the left side). The heart is a pump controlling blood flow in 2 circuits; the pulmonary (sending deoxygenated blood from the right side of the heart to the lungs to exchange carbon dioxide for oxygen) and the systemic (sending oxygenated blood from the left side of the heart to the systemic circuit body as a whole). The septum (perpendicular line between the right and left heart) with special cells in the right atrium and some of its own make up the pacemaker; it contracts continuously without tiring to form the heart beats.
- 2. February is Heart Awareness Month. Coronary heart disease is the number one killer in the United States of America, killing more than 360,000 people yearly. Heart attack signs include chest discomfort, pressure, squeezing or pain, discomfort in other parts of the body (back, neck, arms, jaw or stomach, shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort, breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness. Call 911 for help!
- 3. February is Heart Awareness Month. The American Heart Association recommends physical therapy for overall cardio-vascular health:
 - 1) At least 30 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity daily or
 - 2) minutes of vigorous activity at least 3 days a week
 - 3) Moderate high intensity muscle strengthening at least 2 days/week
- 4. February is Heart Awareness Month. Five Amazing Facts About The Human Heart.
 - 1) The blood vessels in your heart are the most likely to clog.
 - 2) Nearly half of all heart attacks have no symptoms. No symptom attacks are more common in men but deadlier in women.
 - 3) Maybe the best food for your heart? It might be bananas.

- 4) Spare parts for your heart may come from outer space.
- 5) A great sport for your heart? Grab a racket.

Blood Pressure Checks will be when needed.




