

Autumn is here! Remember to get your <u>Flu</u> and "<u>Shingles</u>" vaccines soon!! Check with our doctor to be certain you are a good candidate for the vaccinations.

Our Health News for October:

- October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Breast cancer is the second most common cancer among women; one in eight will get it. Most can survive if the cancer if found early enough and treated. Spread the word about mammograms and early detection to make a difference about quality and length of life.
- 2. October is National Intimate Partner Violence Awareness Month. Intimate partner violence is a serious preventable public health problem that affects millions of Americans. Intimate partner violence escribes physical, sexual, or psychological harm by a partner or spouse. It can occur between heterosexual or same sex couples and does not require sexual intimacy. Programs that teach young people skills for dating can prevent violence.
- 3. October is Respiratory Therapist Awareness Month. October is designated to praise those professionals who help patients needing care for their lungs and improving their quality of life.
- 4. October is Mental Health Awareness Month. Helpful hints include: 1) talk about your feelings to someone, 2) keep physically active, 3) eat well balanced foods, 4) take a break, 5) drink sensibly, 6) keep in touch with friends and family, 7) do something you are proud of, 8) accept who you are, 9) see your physician as needed and take any prescribed medications as ordered.
- 5. October is National Orthodontic Health Month. For children (and adults) who have braces, aligners or other appliances, the American Association of Orthodontists offers some advice, especially during Halloween's "Trick or Treat": Avoid sticky, hard crunchy or chewy candy and snacks, avoid hard treats with peanuts, taco chips, ice, and popcorn. Brushing and flossing is more important during Halloween. It is OK to eat soft chocolate and peanut-butter cups. Practice this infor-

mation in order to decrease the chance of breaking your braces. Good Luck!
